

## MLA: Citing a Source that was Reprinted (A Republished Source)

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  - Author: Last name, First name.
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  - Issue and Number, followed by year of publication: 2.2 (1990):
  - Page numbers: #-##.
- Next, insert the printing information of the *reprinting*.
  - After the abbreviation, “Rpt. in” (which stands for “reprinted in”), list the title of the new publication: Rpt. In *Title in Italics*.
  - Editor (following the abbreviation, “Ed.”): Ed. First name Last name.
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  - Page numbers: #-##.
  - The word, “Print”: Print.
