

Apple's iPhone and iPod Touch, using software revision 2.0 or later, can be set up to download e-mail messages, calendar information, and contacts from the Microsoft Exchange e-mail server.

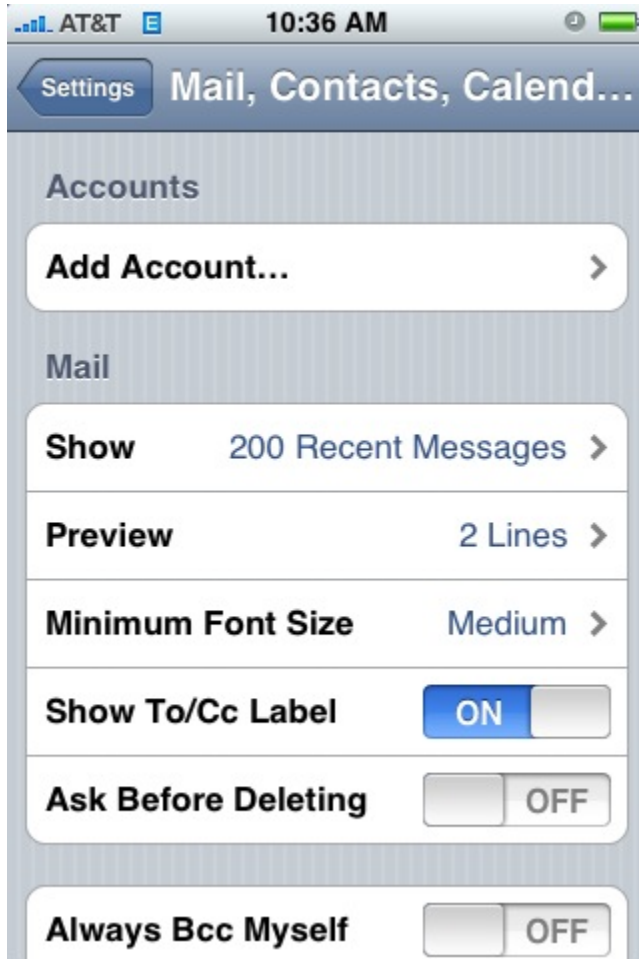
1. Go to the *Home* menu (yours may look different, depending on how it has been customized), and then press **Settings**.



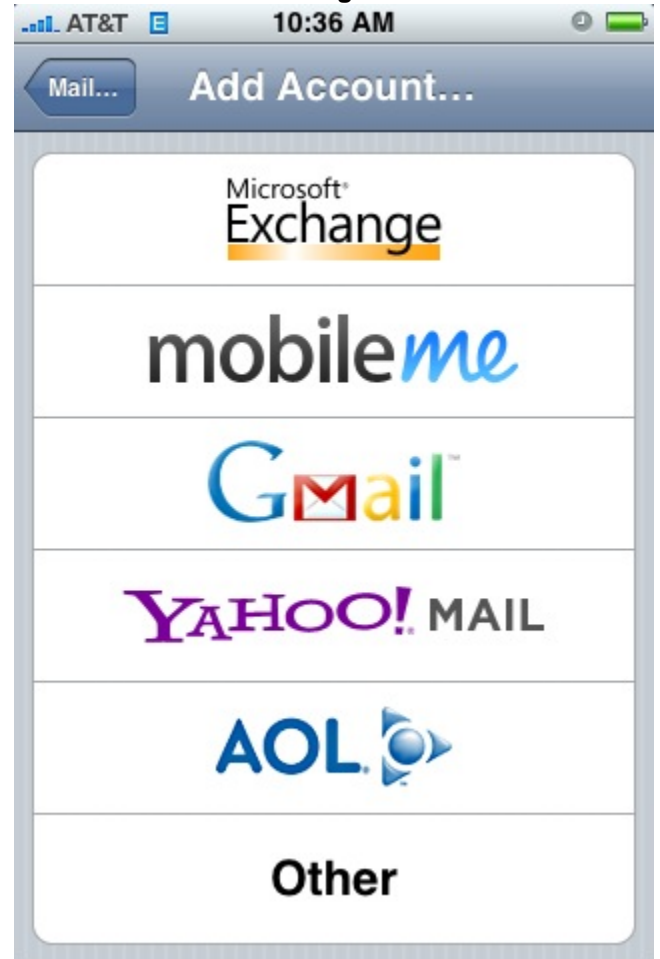
2. In the *Settings* menu, press **Mail, Contacts, and Calendars**.



3. Press **Add Account...**



4. Press **Microsoft Exchange**.



5. Enter your personal information.

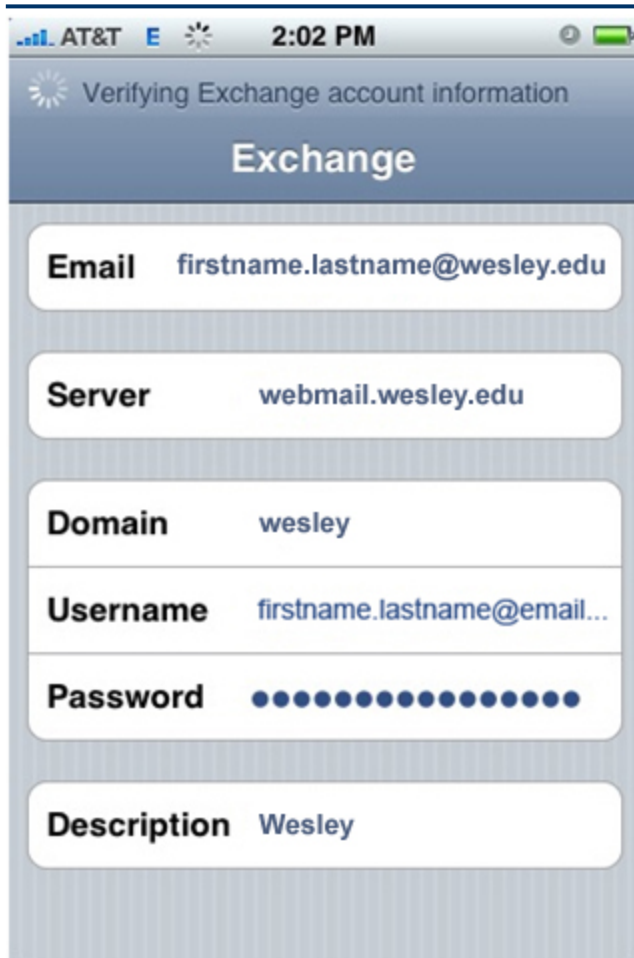

Click **Next**. Press **Details** and press **Accept** for the SSL certificate.

6. Verify the information previously entered, and then enter **webmail.wesley.edu** in the Server field. Click **Next**.



 **NOTE**

Make sure the username is your Windows logon ID **NOT** your Wesley e-mail address.

7. Move the sliders to the ON position for all of the services you would like to use on your iPhone.

Click **Done**.



Your iPhone is now set up to connect to the Exchange server. It may take a few moments to download all of your data, depending on how much there is to synchronize. You can access your messages by returning to the *Home* menu and pressing **Mail**.
